WHEREAS, the Task Force desires to apply for CATPA funding to purchase equipment and pay for overtime associated with joint task force operations, and the State Department of Public Safety requires each agency to submit a separate grant application outlining what their organization will do with the funding; and

WHEREAS, the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office desires to submit a request as a subgrantee to the State Department of Public Safety for an amount of \$75,240.70 of the CATPA funding to purchase needed equipment and pay for personnel overtime associated with task force operations; and

WHEREAS, this Board supports the efforts of the Battle South Task Force to provide a comprehensive strategy addressing automobile theft across bordering jurisdictions and authorizes the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office to make this request for the aforementioned funding.
