I am also worried that the cracking of the shale will erode the cliff and consume my property and house. We have taken pictures and have attached them for your review. As you can see many of them show the shale and how it is starting to erode. One picture will show the size of a hole as big as our ATV. We feel that an engineer should be looking further into this to make sure that our house will not cave into the canyon. No mention of this has been done. We are aware that Seth has talked to several neighbors and has assured them that we have agreed to sign. We have not ONCE been approached by Black Hills and we have NOT agreed to sign anything.

Talking with Seth about Aspen Snowmass and burying the lines, Seth said the expenditure is too much but Aspen could afford it. This was mentioned in the last court hearing. Are they discriminating against people of Penrose because they do not have enough money.

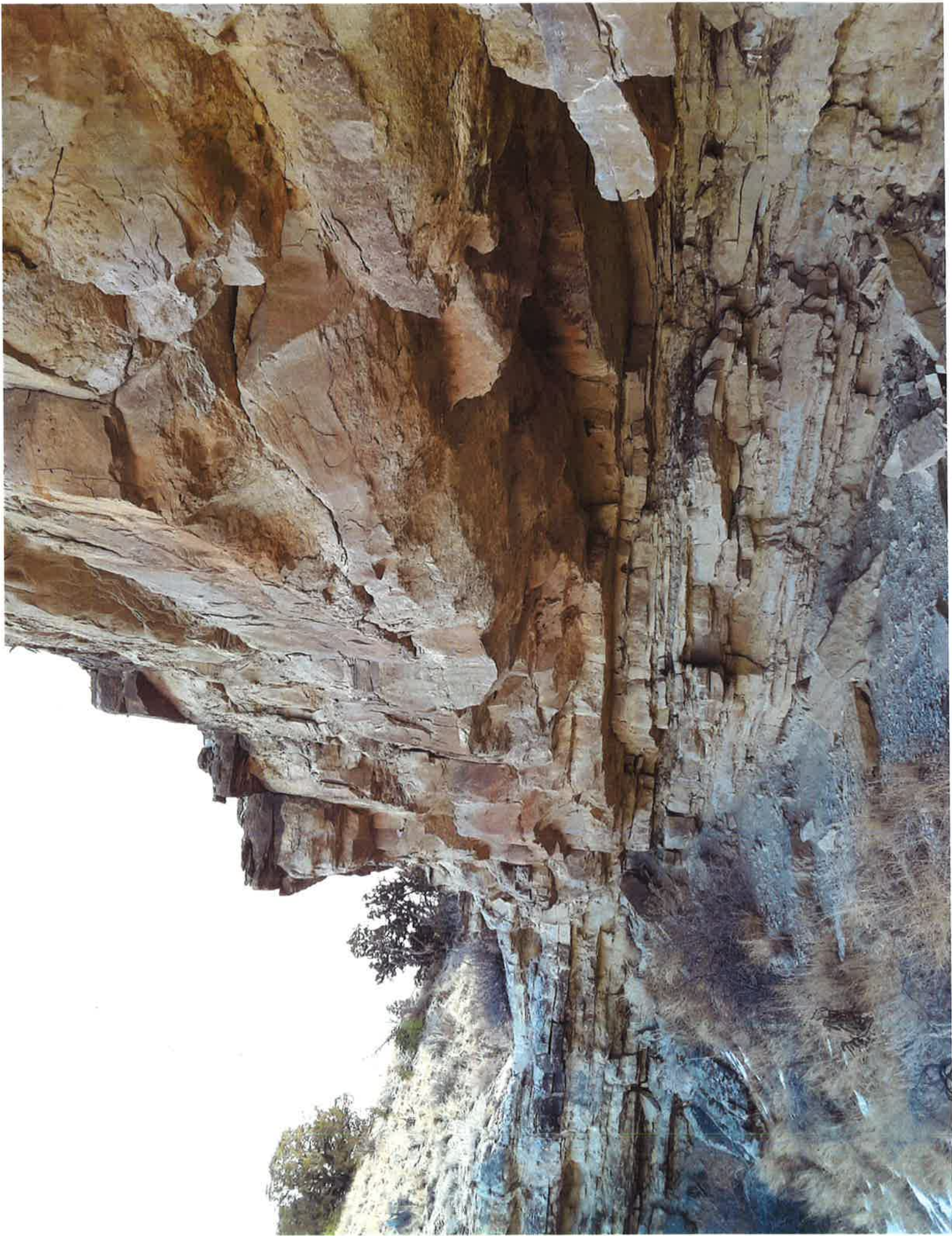

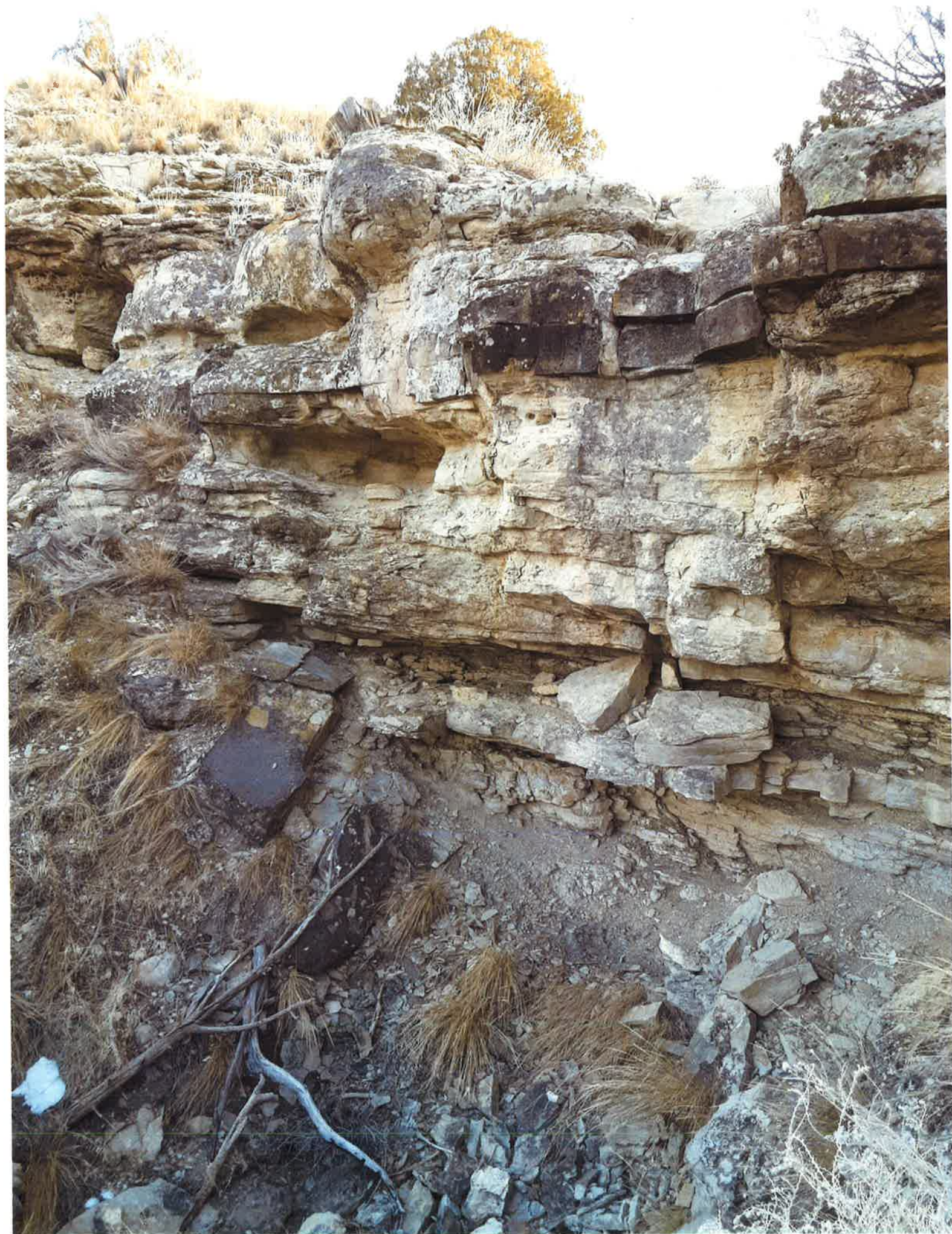
